FROM THE RABBI'S STUDY

Praying for the New President

This article was written on January 6, the day on which the presidential election results were certified by Congress. Many people are anxious about what these next 4 years in

America will look like. Others are looking forward to what President Trump will accomplish. No matter our feelings about the new president it is appropriate to pray for him and our country.

At the synagogue board meeting on Monday evening January 6 I shared the following prayer written and recited by Rabbi Dr. Nelson Glueck (president of the Reform Movement Hebrew Union College) at the inauguration of President Kennedy in 1961. The style is outdated but the sentiments are still relevant. It is a hopeful prayer and one which should always inspire us to advocate for these ideals.

"We turn to Thee, O God, in deepest gratitude on this exalting day of reaffirmation of our Nation's ideals and unity, and of personal avowal of sacred obligation by our President, in Thy name. Mayest Thou, O God, to whom alone belong the dominion and the power, be his stay and support in the fulfillment of his awesome trust, to insure the unfettered implementation of the spirit and letter of our Constitution for all the inhabitants of our

land, to provide them in law and in fact equal opportunities of learning and labor and well-being, to safeguard the physical and moral integrity of our beloved Commonwealth, founded on faith in Thee. O Thou, who art the source of all life, quicken his heart always with the awareness of Thy presence, and especially in the lonely moments of fateful decisions which may be his to make for us and our world. Guard and guide him in Thy loving kindness, that through his leadership hunger may be stilled, hurts healed, hope sustained, the weak and the worn assisted, human dignity and decency up-held, the blight of war and the specter of annihilation banished, and peace in freedom prevail among all Thy children everywhere, with none to make them afraid.

"In profound humility, O God, we pray that Thy blessing may rest upon our President and all associated with him in our Government, which we the people have set in authority, upon everyone and everything dear and precious to him and us, as we repeat the ever new words of the ancient prayer in sacred writ: May the Lord bless thee and keep thee. May the Lord cause His countenance to shine upon thee and be gracious unto thee, May the Lord lift up His countenance unto thee and grant thee peace."

On My Mind

A few weeks ago, on one of my foraging trips through the shelves of my local public library, I came across a lesserknown story by Ray Bradbury, Something Wicked This Way Comes. The title is from a line in Act IV of Macbeth; "By the prick-

ing of my thumbs, something wicked this way comes" – a foreboding warning.

I recall having been enticed to see the 1983 movie version – a rather dark story that was produced, oddly enough, by Walt Disney Productions. The storyline was inspired by Bradbury's memories of growing up in the mid-West and his fascination with the circus show that came to his town. In the movie, the circus that arrives is led by the ominous 'Mr. Dark' (no subtlety there) and two teenage boys soon discover that the its strange collection of performers set about to prey on the hopes and vanities of the town's inhabitants. It features a magic carousel that has the ability to age its riders, both forward and backwards, depending upon their hopes. Mr. Dark sets his sights on enticing the two boys, while the aging father of one, played by Jason Robards, is challenged to protect them, while also fighting inner demons of his own.

Alas, the title and the storyline resonated. Over recent weeks, there was a growing sense of concern as the 'circus' approached Washington DC, and that has intensified as it has begun 'setting up its tents' here. We're only two weeks in and already we've been treated to a succession of events that once would have been unthinkable.

If this strikes some as overly alarmist ... well, I plead guilty as charged ... because I AM alarmed.

To be sure, I try to always keep an open mind and am even willing to acknowledge that there are some proposed

changes that make good sense and, dare I say it, might even be overdue. For instance, I will not mind at all if we stop minting new pennies! They DO cost more to produce than they are actually worth, the existing pennies aren't going to suddenly all disappear instantly, and most people rarely use cash, and fewer use coins. I am a fan of Lincoln ... but let's face it, being put on the lowly penny is hardly an honor and he'll still have the \$5 bill.;-)

I am also willing to tolerate references to the newly renamed Gulf of America. After all, changing the names of geographic places has always been a 'thing.' My father was born in Konigsburg, Germany, but before that, it was the capital of 'East Prussia' ... and now the maps show it as Kaliningrad, Russia. So, the name of my father's birthplace has been overwritten. Odd, but ultimately unimportant. Yes, the reason for this particular name change is petty and offensive to many, and I surely agree that we should be sensitive to historic names ... but let's face it, we've renamed everything in this country somewhere along the way. Washington? Baltimore? The world moves on. But I am admittedly not interested in crippling and/or eliminating entire federal agencies that serve to protect us from, among other things, deadly childhood diseases, unsafe food production, untested medicines, health epidemics and corporate greed.

And I have even less interest in seeing millions of lawabiding people who have lived in the US for most if not all of their lifetimes and who contribute so much to our nation's fabric seized and deported. I still haven't gotten over the many children who were separated from their parents in the last go round. What is especially sad is how many of the proposed actions are just mean-spirited.

Ok ... life does NOT always imitate art ... but here's hoping, as was the case in the movie, that the real-life carousel can be halted and the fascination of many with the circus that has come to our nation's capital can be countered.

In February we celebrate the minor holiday of *Tu B'Shevat*, also known as 'The New Year/Birthday of the Trees.' At the beginning of the Common Era, the 15th of *Shevat* was designated as a time for planting in Israel. It was also a traditional time for the annual tithe (*ma'aser*), that one-tenth of the harvest should be set aside for a religious offering. Today people celebrate all over the world with special *Tu B'Shevat* seders, modeled after the Passover *seder*. These ritualistic observances include the Seven Species/*Shiv'at HaMinim* that grow in the Land of Israel, as listed in *Deuteronomy* 8:8: wheat, barley, figs, pomegranates, olives and dates.

Tu B'Shevat also reminds us that humans are responsible for taking care of the earth. If you have ideas as to how Shaare Tefila can do more to reduce waste, etc., please contact me. 


