

# **Hoping For Change While Living In Troubling Times**

I find it very difficult and saddening to read the news every day. I am a person who is guided by my deeply rooted Jewish values. My love of Judaism and passion for Jewish text and rituals have

helped me understand how I am so supposed to live a life of meaning. Those Jewish principles have taught me that all of humanity is created in the image of God and that we are supposed to love our fellow human beings as we love ourselves. Everything else we do — how we conduct our affairs all day and every day — derive from those two foundational principles.

Those values are not unique to Judaism. All religions teach that humanity contains a Divine spark, and all religions teach social justice. Yet, I see that we are living in an age when these very basic, core principles of western civilization are under attack. And as a result, I find myself living in a fog - overwhelmed by the news of antisemitic attacks, Israel being isolated, climate change being denied, immigrants cowering in fear, and the list can go on and on - and I'm not sure how to find hope.

Our tradition — developed by the rabbis who lived 1500-2000 years ago — provides a spiritual path for us living in dark times. We must remember that no matter

how bleak we think life is today, it was worse in rabbinic times. The Temple in Jerusalem was destroyed, the people of Israel were exiled and/or enslaved. Jewish life seemed to be coming to an end. Even in the midst of the what, until the Holocaust, was the darkest time in Jewish history, the rabbis found hope.

In these weeks leading up to the High Holidays - 7 weeks from the fast day of *Tisha B'Av* (commemorating the destruction of the Temple) to *Rosh HaShanah* - the rabbis have us read prophetic selections from the latter chapters of *Isaiah*. These "haftorot" chanted after the *Torah* reading on *Shabbat* morning provide hope in the midst of despair. Scholars believe that Isaiah lived in exile in Babylonia after the 1st Temple was destroyed and he claimed that despite ample evidence to the contrary God still loves us. He claimed that God wants us to be good people, to continue to follow the *Torah* and to be examples of righteous living. The way to overcome hopelessness, Isaiah teaches, is to remain a part of the community, to continue to be guided by Jewish principles and to know that God loves us.

Yes, these are difficult times. Yes, Jewish and social justice values are being threatened. But our community is strong. Our values are Good and eternal. And our faith is resilient. Together we pray that the year 5786 will be one of change and blessing.

# On My Mind - A "Trashy" Piece

When my children were young, we used to take frequent walks around our neighborhood. I made it a habit to always make sure that we brought some small plastic bags, and along the way, we would pick up various trash

and recycling items that we found lying about along the way. There was almost always something, and more after trash and recycling pickup days, when, inevitably, some items didn't get fully transferred from the bin to the truck. And windy days could really leave an added mess.

I also taught them to pay attention to the sewer grates and, when necessary, we would use a nearby stick to clear away any accumulated debris. This was especially necessary in autumn, lest, come winter, fallen leaves would clog the grates, thereby impeding the melt of snow and ice and the flow of water.

They delighted in these efforts, and we all took pride in "cleaning up the neighborhood." It didn't hurt that neighbors frequently noticed and expressed their appreciation. And the neighborhood DID thereby remain noticeably pristine.

All of my children are now grown, but my habit persists. My wife and I take periodic walks in the neighborhood and a couple of plastic bags always accompany me. Also, when we travel about, in parking lots everywhere I often see and pick up loose bottles and cans.

More significantly, at least once each week, I make it a point to walk the grounds of a nearby elementary and high school and armed with my plastic bags, I pointedly pick up much of what I find at each. During the school year, it's noticeably horrible in the aftermath of a Friday night football game, but even in recent weeks, while the schools are in recess, I typically manage to fill, no exaggeration, 4-5 kitchen garbage bags with plastic bottles, caps and other assorted items. A bag full on the tennis courts, a bag full on the basketball courts at each of the two schools, a slew left by the softball fields, and even on the playground (!) ... and always a large number of water and Gatorade bottles left on the track/playing field. This despite the fact that there ARE trash and

recycling bins on the premises. Evidently, people who play sports can't muster up the energy to bend down, pick up their plastic bottles, and walk 25 yards to the recycling bins?

Why bother? I know that my cleanup at only two public school sites will hardly make a difference. I am also aware that there is a lot of potentially valid critique of what actually happens to all of the bottles and cans that are collected. But I have seen photos of the 'plastic islands' in the oceans ... and I know that every bottle and cap that I don't pick up stands a higher likelihood of ending up there. So, I do my part as I recall this quote by Johann Wolfgang von Goethe, "Let everyone sweep in front of his own door, and the whole world will be clean."

But this weekly exercise also runs deeper. It's about attitude. There are so many problems in this world of ours that are overwhelming ... and we can easily just throw up our hands in despair, defeated by the sheer enormity of it all. Why bother, indeed. My weekly recycling vigilance offers a reminder of missive offered by Rabbi Tarfon; *Pirkei Avot* 2:16, "It is not your duty to finish the work, but neither are you at liberty to neglect it." Wise words indeed. Let's all rededicate ourselves to do our part ...

# **Upgrades at Shaare Tefila**

You may think that the summer months are "slow" ... and yes, the level of programming is reduced as school is on recess, monthly dinners take a pause, and many people go on vacation. However, summer is also a time to try to take advantage of the reduced activity and tackle some other types of projects. Here are some of our undertakings:

- Over the summer, we engaged ZeroDraft to replace ALL of our existing lighting with more energy-efficient fixtures. This included ALL areas of both the inside and outside, including the parking lot lights. You may notice that the new lighting is a bit brighter and whiter. In the process, they have also repaired a few lights that weren't fully working some parking lot lights and some running lights along the walkways in our playground. Roughly 85% of the cost was covered by energy savings incentives and a small remaining portion will be paid out over the next 2 years, presumably offset by reduced usage and savings.
- Earlier this year, the bridge-walkway leading from the parking lot to our office area was fully refurbished and the deteriorated concrete was replaced. More recently, the accumulated rust was fully removed, and the metal areas were re-coated and re-painted.
- We caught up on a long-standing task of placing a backlog of orders for new bricks for the walkway outside of the main entrance. A total of seven bricks were ordered and delivered in July and sometime in August we will see that they are installed. I note that, while we will accept orders for new bricks year-round, installing them will remain a once-eachsummer task.
- In late July we installed two "replacement" banners; a
  replacement for our Israel banner, that was defaced
  in June, and a replacement for the "Hate Has No
  Home Here" banner, as the wording on the original
  banner had faded significantly.

- Finally, while it will take some months to complete, we have contracted with Shul Solutions and have begun the effort to replace our existing website with one that will be fully integrated with our existing ShulCloud system. Here is a short list of reasons why integrating our website into the ShulCloud database will be beneficial:
  - 1. Real-time Data Updates and Customer Access: The ShulCloud-based website will not involve publishing. Content can be easily updated, saved, and will then 'go live' almost instantly. This helps to ensure that the content on our website will be up-to-date.
  - 2. Personalized User Experience ... and Enhanced Security: We will be able to use customer 'tagging' to personalize content and offers, improving user engagement. We will thereby be able to easily show certain content to certain people, or hide content as needed; restricting access of certain areas only to members, school families, or board members (and only when they are logged in).
  - **3. Tailored Promotions:** The new website can be set to automatically feature upcoming events in various categories, display *Shabbat* times, etc. This will improve the staff's ability to prioritize activities and should enhance the user experience.
  - **4. Improved Analytics:** Access to detailed insights into user behavior and website performance.

This effort is headed up by Ira Kolmaister and Ofer Zajicek, with staff guidance provided by Babette Cohn. Once the framework of the new site has been built out, we will be seeking input and (new) content from various arms of the congregation, which can each have devoted pages of their own.

We hope that you will be pleased with the improvements.




